

## City Employes Contribute To Area Charities

City employes contributed \$1052 to organized charities through their civil service association welfare plan in 1959-60, it was announced today.

Dick Rausch, association president, noted that the total, collected through the payroll deduction plan between its institution last September and July 1, was \$400 more than individual donations the preceding year.

Contributions are divided between six organized charities on the basis of percentages indicated by individual employes.

Fenton Hamm, chairman of the welfare committee, noted that the second annual drive presently is under way.

He said 100 employes presently are enrolled. Previously, between 88 and 130 city employes participated in charities on an individual basis.

The plan includes simple payroll deductions of from two-tenths to one-half of 1 per cent of gross income.

Thus, a person earning \$256 monthly might contribute from \$6.14 to \$15.36 annually while a higher-up earning \$966 monthly might contribute from \$23.18 to \$57.96.

On enrollment, the employe simply marks the percentage of each dollar he wants to go to the following participants: Cancer fund, Community Chest, Crippled Children's fund, Heart fund, Red Cross and Salvation Army.

All can go to one organization. Lump payments are made annually to the various funds, and solicitation of individuals in city hall offices is prohibited.

Rausch, in urging all city employes to consider the program, has noted that they "are definitely assuming stature as responsible citizens of the community doing their fair share to help those less fortunate."
