7-20-58 No Decision Reached By UC Regents

No decision has been reached by the University of California regents on the site of the proposed new campus in the region south of San Francisco on the Monterey peninsula.

The regents, meeting Friday in San Francisco, said only they are seeking campus sites in the northern California and Central Valley areas.

A San Francisco morning newspaper said it had learned from a "private source" that the new northern California campus is almost certain to be located at one of three sites in the Santa Cruz-Monterey area. It would draw students from San Mateo, Santa Clara, San Benito, Monterey and Santa Cruz counties.

Plans to expand UC's La Jolla campus to make it the nucleus of a new university branch in the San Diego area were announced.

An engineering and technical school will be built there, the regents said, "if site problems can be worked out."

The expansions are part of a 55 million dollar capital improvement program to meet increased enrollment of 42,000 to 58,000 by 1962.

They also reported agreement with Stanford university for the two schools to pool their graduate school facilities.

Graduate students and professors in each university may take courses in the others under the plan.

The regents said that while continuing undergraduate instruction on a "substantial scale," the Berkeley campus will place "primary emphasis" on graduate studies.

In other action Friday regents accepted gifts and pledges totaling \$1,169,021.
