The trees have been cited by the Santa Cruz Arbor Day Committee for their age, size, rarity, beauty or historical significance.

While the heritage tree awards began three years ago, plaques for all 22 specimens were just installed last week by joint city and California Conservation Corps crews.

Harry Clarke, city field crew leader, said the plaque installation was delayed due to lack of funds. Money was eventually raised through the sale of Arbor Day posters and T-shirts.

He added that the traditional Arbor Day tree-planting has been delayed to November due to the drought situation. The city has about 80 15-gallon trees ready to plant for interested residents.

Alisa Goldman, crew supervisor for the Conservation Corps, added that the department is hiring for upcoming fire season. Interested persons should go to the **Employment Development Depart**ment, 2200 Soquel Ave., between 1-248-2713 for information.
