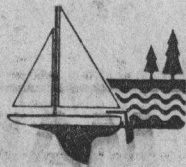

Another Boardwalk murder suspect arrested

SANTA CRUZ — Police have arrested the fourth person wanted for the murder of a Fresno man near the Boardwalk Monday night.

Taken into custody Tuesday afternoon at Santa Cruz High School was Andre Stephen Motley, 16, B-26 Koshland Way. He was transferred to Juvenile Hall, where he is being held on suspicion of murder and attempted robbery, said Assistant District Attorney David Gen-

occhio.

Motley is not a Santa Cruz High student, according to a school spokesman.

Also being held at the hall is one of two brothers arrested in the case. He is Robert Garvin, 17, of 4231 Starboard Court, Soquel. He faces the same charges.

The two juveniles will be brought before Judge Donald May Thursday morning for a hearing to determine if they should be detained in custody at the hall or released,

said Genocchio.

The other brother, Glenn Garvin, 21, is scheduled to be arraigned today in Municipal Court on charges of murder and attempted robbery.

The fourth suspect, Kittrell Keller, 20, 2006 Mission St., will not be arraigned until Thursday, a spokesman with the district attorney's office said.

Santa Cruz Police Lt. Dan Fite said two other male teen-agers, aged 14 and 17, were picked up for questioning and later released.

Police suspect the victim, a 38-year-old Fresno man described as a transient, was repeatedly stabbed to death Monday night during a robbery attempt at the parking lot at Third and Beach streets.

The victim has not been positively identified, but papers in his possession indicated he was from the Fresno area. The coroner's office is attempting to identify him today.

The man died of numerous stab wounds, said Fite. He suffered a wound to the center of his chest, which pierced his heart, said Fite. He also suffered wounds to his leg, arm and hand.

Police believe the victim struggled violently with his assailants. Two of the suspects also suffered stab wounds.

Those two suspects—the Garvin brothers went to Santa Cruz Community Hospital with Keller to get treatment. While there, police questioned them on the way in which they had been injured.

The Garvins told a police detective they'd been hurt in a fight with gang members.

At about the same time they were telling this story, police were notified about the injured man in the parking lot. The man died at Community Hospital, about an hour after the attack.

Fite said footprints at the scene of the slaying matched the kind of soft-soled shoes the Garvin brothers were wearing.

Working on other evidence police obtained, the Garvins were taken into custody at the hospital.

A few hours later, police picked up Keller at his sister's home on Raymond Street, said Fite.

The two adults, Glenn Garvin and Keller, are being held at County Jail in lieu of \$500,000 bail.
