Alba observes 90th July 4th

Those attending will gather to watch the flag raising and bell tolling at 11 a.m. The traditional auction will follow, beginning at 1 p.m.


The Alba Schoolhouse 4th of July celebration began when the schoolhouse was built in 1895. Pupils who attended the school, which was closed down in 1940 and converted into a public library, will be on hand for the celebration.

Alba Recreation District not only has the distinction of being the smallest in the state, it is also the only one that does not levy a tax.

Gotthold said the local festivities are done in a traditional American way.

"We just have a regular oldfashion picnic." said Gotthold. "We have nothing but fun!"
