# Boulder Creek Library Plan Faces Board

Supervisor Joe Cucchiara will urge the county board Tuesday to proceed with plans to build a new library in Boulder Creek, noting the county has more than \$500,000 to do the job and has title to about two-thirds of an acre in the north county town for the facility.

The board meets at 9 a.m. in room 525 of the County County, and the library item is the ninth on the agenda.

Cucchiara, representative of the San Lorenzo-Scotts Valley area, is moving the city-county library board's recommendation that the new library be at least 4,600 square feet in size.

Cucchiara wants the board to encourage local architects and builders to bid on the job.

Earlier in the morning, the board is scheduled to consider endorsement of a

county Seniors Commission request that the state Senior Citizens' Legal Services investigate procedures at La Posada Senior Housing Facility on Frederick Street.

The local commission and state legal services note that complaints about La Posada include statements the senior housing facility has failed to fully recruit low-income seniors, that last December it dropped its breakfast program, and that

other programs have not been kept up according to the federal guidelines it must meet.

The board also will look at county regulations on moving of homes from one location to another within the county and at a request the county and city of Santa Cruz hire experts to look at cable television franchises.
