Goodwill Gets State Aid To Begin **Expansion Of Rehabilitation Center**

ood will Industries and the tate Department of Vocational Rehabilitation has ended with an agreement to expand the re-

and to upgrade its program. The center is located at 350 Encinal street.

marks the The agreement first time a contract has been completed between the state agency and a private group.

The total project calls for an expenditure of \$160,000 with the Goodwill Industries paying almost 38 per cent of the cost. Ernest Damkroger, president of the Goodwill board of directors, said remodeling and construc-tion will start early this month. Darrow Palmer who is in charge of construction, estimates the job will be finished by October 15.

The workshop and office space will be increased 17,500 square feet in order to accommodate the psychological and medical programs, a contract, dry cleaning and upholstering department. Because of the expansion, there will be about 200 people in the Goodwill program daily. This is 30 per cent more employs than at present.

About \$30,000 will be spent

About \$30,000 will be spent modern equipment for the y cleaning, radio and telesion, transportation and furnise departments in About \$30,000 will vision, transportation and furni-ture departments in order to acquaint trainees with some of the latest equipment in com-petitive industry.

Gus Wahlberg is chairman of the equipment committee. He was in charge of studying and assessing equipment needs and evaluating potentials for vari-ous departments.

"We are grateful to both the department of rehabilitation and to the many friends of Goodwill Industries for making this expansion possible. Certainly, when we consider the success we've had in the field of rehabilitation, we can only say that it is due to the benevolence of those who have so generously

or those who have so generously supported our G o o d will program," said Damkroger.

Others assisting in the new center were Dr. Nathan Nelson, chief rehabilitation workshop consultant for California, who obtained the grant for expansion, and Ray Barton, district administrator for the rehabilitation department. Barton acted tion department. Barton acted

in an advisory capacity in for-mulating the detailed proposal. "Ever conscious of the fact that we are dealing with the complexity of human personality, we keep the Goodwill standards in check, not only through regular monthly meetings of the board and its committees, but by a close relationship with both the Goodwill Industries field counsellors from Washington, counsellors from Washington, and the state rehabilitation counsellors," Damkroger continued. He added thanks to the

tinued. He added thanks to the Goodwill corporate and local board members for their time and effort given to the project.
