Coast Unit To Consider Deer Park

Deer Park came under the commission's purview with passage of the Coastal Law in January and the commission took authority at a point where the multi-million dollar shopping center was about one-half built out, according to developers.

Commission staff put a stoporder on the project pending decision on the request for ex-

emption.

A request by California Parks Department to renovate the Hoover Ranch property, now state park, has been continued over to a latter meeting at the request of the state. It had been scheduled for Monday on the preliminary agenda.

Other items going before the commission include a request by the City of Santa Cruz to do paving and curbs and gutters on streets throughout West Santa Cruz and west of the Yacht Harbor (scheduled at 4 p.m.) and discussion of low and moderate-income house scheduled for the morning session.
