Dysle Named Deputy Mayor

Mayor And Assistant Mayor

Jack L. Chiorini, 44-year-old native of Santa Cruz, accountant, and civic leader, was unanimously re-elected mayor of Santa Cruz for another term by the city council last night.

Clifford L. Dysle, East Side appliance dealer and council member since last year's elections, was elected assistant mayor to succeed Charles M. Brunjes.

In nominating Chiorini for re-election, Councilman and former Mayor Sam C. McNeely praised Chiorini's conduct in office, his handling of many problems confronting the mayor, and his devotion to duty.

In accepting, Chiorini expressed the confidence that council and citizenry would continue to back the mayor, and expressed the hope that every citizen would accept his responsibilities by participating in government and above all, by voting.

Dysle also thanked the council for their confidence in electing him to the deputy mayor's position.

During the balance of the meeting, the flood control and river beautification commission recommended that a master plan for flood control of the San Lorenzo river and Branciforte creek channels be drawn up by qualified engineers.

The commission also advocated that the council levy the full 10 cents flood control tax authorized by the charter during the coming fiscal year to create funds necessary to carry out the provisions of such a master plan. At the present time, only four cents of the authorized 10 cents are levied.

No action was taken on the proposal last night.

Discussion of the parking problem on the municipal wharf also led to nowhere. A recommendation of Police Chief Al Huntsman that parking meters be installed on the wharf was indignantly rejected by wharf tenants present at the meeting. The council finally stated that the status quo would be maintained until further recommendations were submitted by wharf tenants.

Approval was given to start abandonment proceedings on land off Bay street on request by Ernest Hilliker, 170 West Cliff drive.

Other business included opening of two bids for road oil and one bid for the auditorium concession, and granting of a driveway permit to Art J. Grever, 526 Trevethan avenue.
