Santa Cruz Library Film Series To Begin Thursday

A Thursday film series will begin this week at the main branch of the Santa Cruz public library, corner of Church and Center Streets, according to Alma Westberg, film librarian.

Three films will be shown from 3 to 4 p.m. in the first of the weekly film series. They include "Forest Murmurs," which is a short color film on nature; "The English of Elizabeth I," a color film on English history and literature of the 16th century; and "Bow Bells," about contemporary London back streets with music hall entertainers.

The second part of the series will be July 23 in which an hour-long film on "The Meaning of Modern Painting" will be shown.

Scheduled July 30 is "People of a City: Stockholm," and "Land of the Swiss," as well as a film on the British Columbia Rockies, "Land of the Overlanders."

All showings will be in the

library conference room on the second floor, beginning at 3 p.m.

The library is able to offer the film series to the public since becoming a member of the Northern California Library Film Circuit with 23 other libraries. The circuit rotates its 240 16-mm films on a monthly basis to members.

The films, in the art and music department of the library, are available to civic, church, cultural, service and other organizations on one-day loans.
