
Okay, Now Let It Rain





Workmen tie in circuity to connect three heavy-duty pumps which will carry off storm water which would pile up behind levees during periods of high river flow and high surface runoff. Pumping Station 1 is off Laurel street extension near Spruce street. Other stations are on the east bank of the river near Water street and near San Lorenzo boulevard and Bixby street. Capacity of the eight pumps at the three stations is 32,000 gallons perminute, according to Knute Hansston, projects engineer for the army corps of engineers here. Hansston said the pumps would be ready for action by Thanksgiving. A drain complex connected with the levee work will carry off water and dump it into the river until the level gets to high. When gravity leaves off, the pumps will be turned on to prevent storm water from damaging property while the levees save the city as a whole from river flood waters.

Banker Is **Killed By** Holdup Man

New York (M.—A 55-year-old bank manager was shot and killed today as three robbers took an estimated \$8000 to \$10,000 from a Queens bank. A customer in the bank received a leg wound.

Police identified the manager as James F. Duggan.

The holdup was staged shortly before 11 a.m. at the United National Bank of Long Island, located at a busy shopping intersection in the Richmond Hill section of Queens.

The bandits fled in a sedan which had been stolen in Nassau county. The auto later was found abandoned half a mile from the bank.
