Murder Charge Dropped

Murder charges were dropped today against an 18vear-old Scotts Valley man arrested in connection with a raid and fatal shooting at a Soquel marijuana farm in late October.

The district attorney's office today filed an amended complaint against Daniel Pierce which did not carry the murder charge. Pierce still faces charges of harboring a criminal and conspiracy to commit an armed robbery.

Pierce was arrested with seven other juveniles in connection with the fatal shooting of 30-year-old Dennis Johnson at his Soquel marijuana farm.

Five of the juveniles admitted to robbery charges on the condition that the district attorney's office drop murder charges against them.

A sixth juvenile agreed to testify for the prosecution and does not face charges in connection with the case. The seventh juvenile - 17-year-old Norman Dillon - is still charged with murder and is currently awaiting a decision to
