County Room Tax Collection For Three Months--\$750

The county's room tax has netted a total of \$750 after three months of enforcement, County Tax Collector A. A. Horton has revealed.

Visitors at county hotels and motels pay the tax as part of the price of a room.

Horton said the \$750 is a slim return on the tax, "but still \$250 more than I expected."

Licenses to operate hotels and motels now total 74, indicating an average \$10 tax return for each rental agency.

Even at the height of the tourist season, Horton predicted only about \$3000 in returns for the tourist quarter of July, August and September.
