

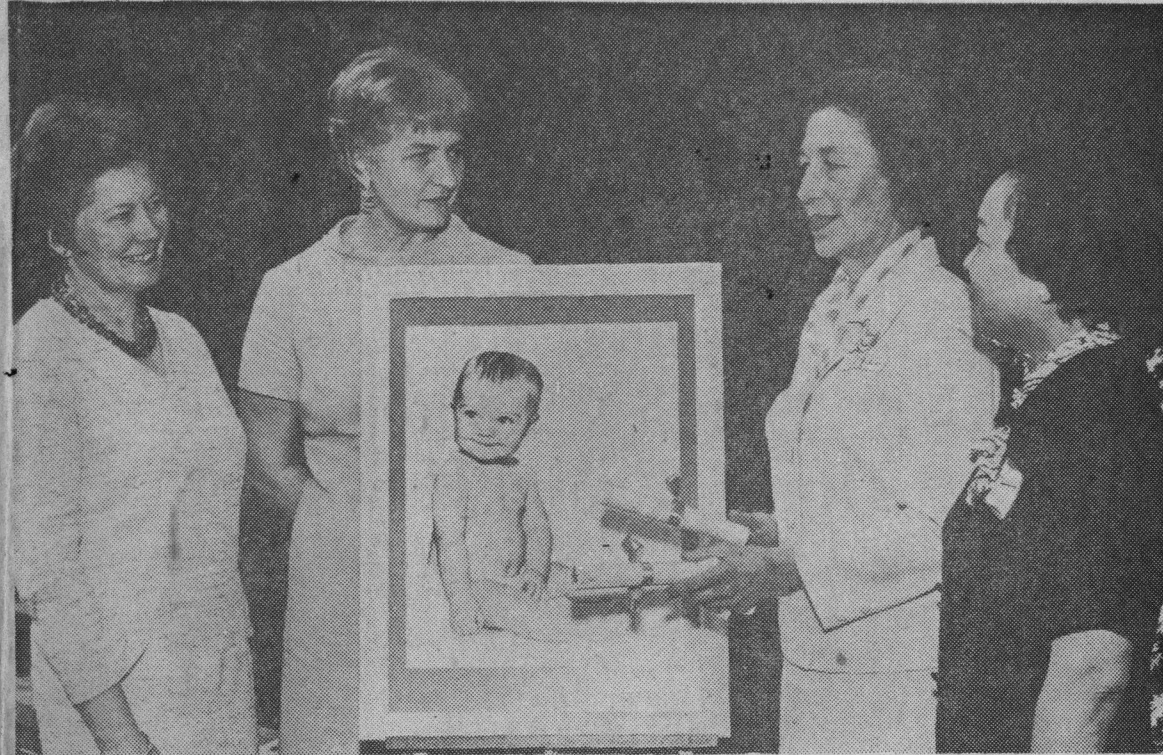
# Perfect Party In The Country

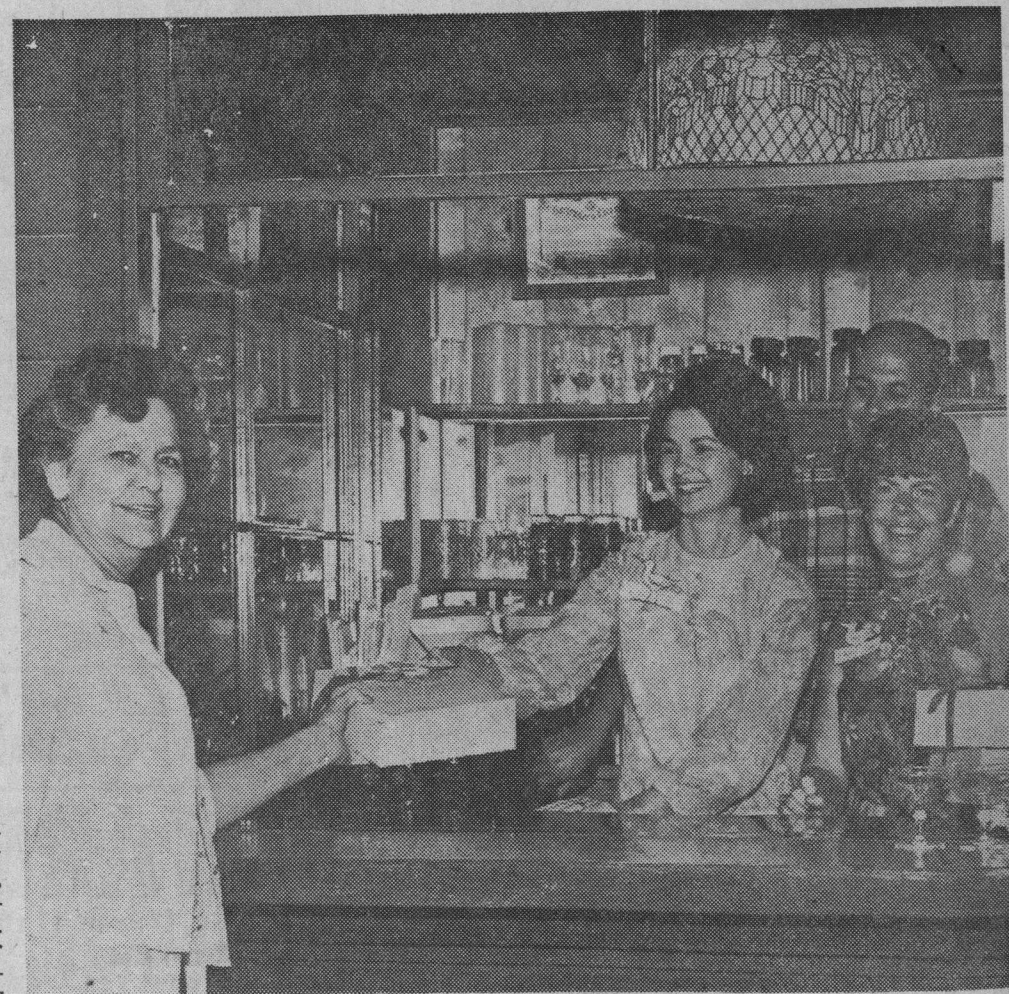
Also on hand was County and City Librarian Geraldine Work who was presented with two books for the library by Mrs. Roger Gintert, book committee chairman. —M.A.S.
