Accused mass murderer Edmund Emil Kemper made a brief appearance in Santa Cruz County Superior Court this morning, but did not enter a plea.

Public defender Jim Jackson moved to have two of the eight counts against Kemper dismissed. Superior-Court Judge Charles Franich con-

tinued the matter until June 28.
Following the hearing Jackson told reporters that he is asking for a dismissal of the charges against Kemper in connection with Anita Luchessa and Mary Ann Pesce. His reasoning in asking for the dismissals was that authorities have not recovered and identified the body of Miss Luchessa, and they have not

Franich continued the matter so Jackson and Dist. Atty. Peter Chang could submit arguments on whether or not the two counts should be dismissed.
