# Scot Or Not, You're Invited To Fling At Ben Lomond Tomorrow, Sunday

Scot or not, you're invited to the two-day festival which opens tomorrow to celebrate Ben Lomond's switch to a Scottish atmosphere.

Brent Rice, chairman of the festival, said he expects 10,000 persons to be on hand during the two days.

Events begin tomorrow morning at 9:30 o'clock with official raising of United States and Scottish flags at the fire house plaza. San Lorenzo Valley post 661, American Legion will participate in the ceremonies and Rev. Jon Bullock of Wee Kirk Presbyterian church will pre-

sent the invocation.

At 11 a.m., a Scottish festival parade is planned, led by grand marshal, Dr. F. A. Whitaker, a Ben Lomond dentist.

Marching in the event will be pipe bands of the City of San Francisco, San Francisco Boy Scout troop 90, and Lockheed.

Following the parade the pipe bands will compete, with judging by Charles Cochrane of Auckland, New Zealand.

Dancing and piping competition is also planned in the Ben Lomond recreation park at 11 a.m. and 1:30 p.m.

At 8 p.m. a program is

planned at the recreation park, with square dance demonstrations and a series of acts by the Bessie Clark variety show group of San Jose.

Festivities Sunday include the 11:30 a.m. official dedication of Loch Lomond, the reservoir behind Newell Creek dam. Water from the real Loch Lomond in Scotland will be poured into the Santa Cruz city water source. Carl Conelly will be master of ceremonies.

Sunday at 2:30 p.m. a program at the recreation park will stress bagpiping and the Bonnie Bon-

nets, eight singing Ben Lomond housewives. At 7:30 p.m. at the park, eight professional dancers from the Scottish Country Dance society of San Francisco will perform in costume.

All events are free.

Both days, Scottish food—including meat pies, pastries and cookies—will be sold at the recreation park and at Wee Kirk church.

Rice said many residents and businessmen of the hamlet will be costumed for the festival, and the town will be decorated in Scottish style.
