Town Clock Print Given To Museum



Santa Cruz town clock may have disappeared from Pacific avenue but it is reappearing in several hundred homes all over the county. Dustine Anderson, local watercolor artist, sketched the clock in a night scene shortly before it was dismantled and taken to the Santa Cruz museum for storage. By popular demand she

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had the watercolor scene reproduced in a limited number of color prints which have been sold to clock lovers in and out of the county. Above, Mrs. Anderson presents the metal plate used in making the print, to Dr. Glenn Bradt, who heads Santa Cruz museum. It will be placed there on display with the old clock, and is marked "not for use until the year 2064." After 100 years, more of the prints may be made, according to Mrs. Anderson.
