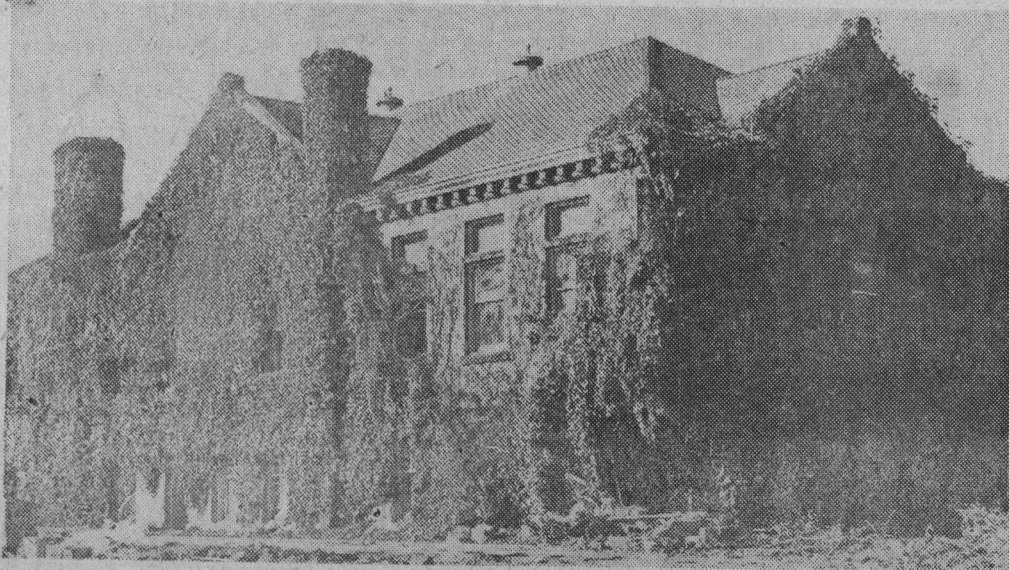

After Six Decades, Library Falls



A lesson in building demolition was given sidewalk superintendents yesterday as Kester and Sons construction razed the main library in downtown Santa Cruz to make room for a new \$847,000 library on the same site. In the picture at left, only a corner of the old building has been removed — where the cornerstone was placed in September, 1903. Soon, however, as shown in the first picture below, the tearing down process was under way with a boom. A bulldozer jumped around like Cassius Clay searching for a weak point, jabbing here, punching there. The attack resulted in the bottom picture. All that remains is rubble.
