The design capacity is for 9000 per day with overflow crowds anticipated on holidays or during tournaments on archery and rifle ranges and ball parks. Annual at-tendance of one million would be expected when facilities are com-

Projected costs of \$1.5 million would be borne to a large extent by private investors, the

study points out.

This would include private development of the golf course and a model railroad on long term concession agreements.

Archers already have developed an excellent roving range and horsemen have assisted in develment of existing riding trails. A rifle range presently is in the discussion stage.

Hector, a Skyline boulevard area resident, was hired by the city in December, primarily to complete the master plan project. However, he has assisted in development of plans for other recreation and park projects.


A club house and natural science center and a developed children's play area are proposed for
