

## DeLaveaga Park Master Design To Be Studied By Councilmen

An 18-hole public golf course, fishing lakes, a model railroad, developed game areas, camping and picnic facilities are envisioned in a master design for DeLaveaga park.

The plan, prepared by acting assistant park superintendent Fred Hector, is being buffed up for presentation to the city council this month.

A \$1.5 million ultimate development cost is indicated, with much of this being borne by private concessionaires.

The park areas were surveyed Friday afternoon by park and recreation commission members, city officials and State Sen. Donald

Grunsky (R-Watsonville).

Grunsky has indicated he will assist with clarification of land titles in areas of the park presently used by national guard.

Hector in a brief analysis of public use values of the park pointed out the recreational significance of the 110 acres deeded to the state in 1901.

"To realize a development adequate to meet recreational needs in the years ahead, the use of this land would be essential," Hector said.

Parks Director Carl Bengston said the city is seeking at least license to use portions of the national guard land.

The recreational use analysis points to the swelling residential ring around the park.

The design capacity is for 9000 per day with overflow crowds anticipated on holidays or during tournaments on archery and rifle ranges and ball parks. Annual attendance of one million would be expected when facilities are completed.

Projected costs of \$1.5 million would be borne to a large extent by private investors, the study points out.

This would include private development of the golf course and a model railroad on long term concession agreements.

Archers already have developed an excellent roving range and horsemen have assisted in development of existing riding trails. A rifle range presently is in the discussion stage.

Hector will present final data for park and recreation commission approval this week.

Hector, a Skyline boulevard area resident, was hired by the city in December, primarily to complete the master plan project. However, he has assisted in development of plans for other recreation and park projects.

A club house and natural science center and a developed children's play area are proposed for the covered bridge area.

Development of a fishing lake and various sporting areas in the meadow there also is envisioned. An amphitheater has been projected for the area south of there.

Another fishing lake and a baseball diamond are spotted near La Corona.

The golf course is proposed for the easterly two-thirds of the park.
