Soquel Porter Memorial

Library has recently been repaired and painted and is modern both in appearance and in its collection of books. The circulation of books at this library has more than doubled in the past few months since the work of renovating was completed. The few months since the work of renovating was completed. The building was a community pro-ject in 1912 and was built with funds raised by local groups, supplemented by the Porter family as a Memorial to their parents.

The building in recent years had been in need of repair and prosion for this work was made in the 1950-51 county budget by the pard of supervisors when the litery contract was increased so that the foundation of the building could be strengthened new vision board of brary co that the foundation of the building could be strengthened, new lights installed and the building painted. The increased cost of operation and need for additional books in all of the county library branches was recognized also at this time and the supervisors, in their contract with the Santa Cruz Public Library, voted additional funds to maintain and provide for the county library branches.

That this action has been beneficial is shown in the increased use of the libraries, the new applications for library privileges, the number of children who borrow books, and the growing use of the library as a source for the answer to many questions.

The Soquel library had its official re-opening December 15, 1951, with the Soquel Improvement club sponsoring the "open house." The Improvement club's library committee had helped in many ways to improve the library, giving its time and work to prepare the building for the repairs and its support in behalf of increased revenue for library serevice. Twin Lakes Library branch serves a large reading public and while open only three days a week is one of the most active of the county branches. The building housing the library is another of the community-provided buildings, originally having been built with funds contributed by interested residents. For many years the library was on the grounds of the Twin Lakes Baptist church. When the new church buildings were being erected it was necessary to move the library building, Again the residents of the area came to the support of the library and through subscriptions purchased a lot for "our library."

the efforts of in the Twin Lakes Through duals and the Twin Lakes Improvement club the building was moved to the library lot on 7th avenue, where new shelving was installed and the building painted. The community has actively supported the library at all times, requesting that adequate funds be and requesting that adequate fund provided for books and other

terials.

The board of supervisors in its 1950-51 contract set aside \$500 for needed improvements to the building and added another \$500 in 1951-52. With the help of volunteer workmen, plans are being made to construct a work area and other facilities. Actual construction has been held up pending the plans of the improvement club to build a community hall adjoining the library. The improvements will be started this spring to the library building to take care of the terials. spring to the o take care of be started this spring to the in-brary building to take care of the increased use of library services.
