## Here's the story . . .

★ Each year you, the taxpayers, pay rent for eight different quarters at an annual cost of \$37,420, IN ADDITION TO THE COST OF MAINTAINING THE COUNTY'S OWN OLD BULDINGS!

★ Each year our population grows, our needs are greater, AND NOW WE HAVE TO RENT EVEN MORE SPACE!

★ Building now, through bonds, permits the fairness of sharing costs with future taxpayers throughout the lives of the new buildings.

\* Bonding now is far less costly than building on "lease-

Bond retirement costs, based on a 5% increase annually in assessed valuation (we have been running much higher than that) would run from a high of 12.8 cents the first year to a low of 4.5 cents and would average 8 cents on the taxes in 20 years. For the past two years the County budget has included 15 cents for building purposes. The saving of \$37,000 in rent would further reduce costs, since these rented quarters will be replaced by offices in the proposed new complex.
