

# Supervisors Delay Consideration Of Market, Want Public Hearing

The controversial proposal to construct a convenience market at the gasoline station on Rio del Mar Boulevard will not be considered by county supervisors Tuesday as originally scheduled.

Supervisors were scheduled to discuss the proposal Tuesday without a public hearing, but have decided to put the matter off until later in the month in order to hold a properly advertised public hearing, according to a spokesman from Supervisors Chairman Robley Levy's office.

When supervisors meet Tuesday beginning at 9 a.m. in room 525 of the County Center, they will set the date for the public hearing on the proposal that has generated extreme opposition from many residents of Rio del Mar.

The gasoline station, owned by Atlantic Richfield Corp., is located near the Rio Del Mar Boulevard overpass on Highway 1.

Scheduled matters that supervisors will be considering Tuesday include adoption of several amendments to the Land Use Plan of the Local Coastal Program and adoption of ordinances designed to implement the Land Use Plan.

As part of their consideration of these ordinances, supervisors will decide just exactly what size condominiums could be built at the Wingspread condominium and convention center development being proposed for the Porter-Sesnon property in Aptos.

Supervisors also will consider adopting a traffic plan for the harbor area which includes making Lake Avenue a one-way street southbound and decreasing the

street to one lane to provide parking on the harbor side.

The plan is designed to alleviate the hazard at the intersection of Lake Avenue and Eaton Street with traffic turning from Lake Avenue left onto Eaton Street.

Both the Local Coastal Program items and the Harbor Area Traffic Study will be considered in the afternoon. Items scheduled for the board's morning session include consideration of drainage problems on 15th Avenue in Live Oak.
