**CABRILLO COLLEGE** will offer a schedule of fully approved college-level courses this fall for the convenience of students who must attend during evening hours.

The college is approved by the California State Department of Education. College-level courses are acceptable to the University of California, as well as the state colleges and by private four-year institutions. All divisions of the college will be approved for training of veterans under the provisions of the Public Laws which provide for veteran's benefits.

**ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION.** Any high school graduate, or any person 18 years of age or over who does not live in another junior college district, is eligible to enroll.

**EXPENSES.** There is no tuition or laboratory fee for enrollment at Cabrillo. Textbooks and supplies are the only items of expense for the student. Textbooks will be sold at the ASB Bookstore.

**TESTING.** For students enrolling in English courses, an English Achievement Test will be required before registration is complete. Those pursuing an A.A. degree through evening classes exclusively must also take a Scholastic Aptitude Test. The counseling department will handle these items with the individual student.

**COUNSELING.** Counselors will be available beginning September 8—7-9 p.m.
