# HOW MUCH WATER IS THAT ?

Paste this in your hat if you ever need to know water equivalents:

- 1 cubic foot is 7.48 gallons or 62.4 pounds of water.
- 1 acre foot is 43,560 cubic feet of 325,900 gallons.
- 1 acre-foot covers 1 acre of land one foot deep.
- 1 cubic foot per second (cfs) is 450 gallons per minute.
- 1 cfs is 646,360 gallons per day, 1.983 acre-feet per day.
- 1 cfs is 59.5 acre-feet per 30 days, 724 acre feet per year.
- 1 million gallons is 3.07 acre-feet
- 1 million gallons per day (mgd) is 1,122 acre-feet per year.
- 1,000 gallons per minute (gpm) is 2.23 cfs.
- 1,000 gpm is 4.42 acre-feet per day.
