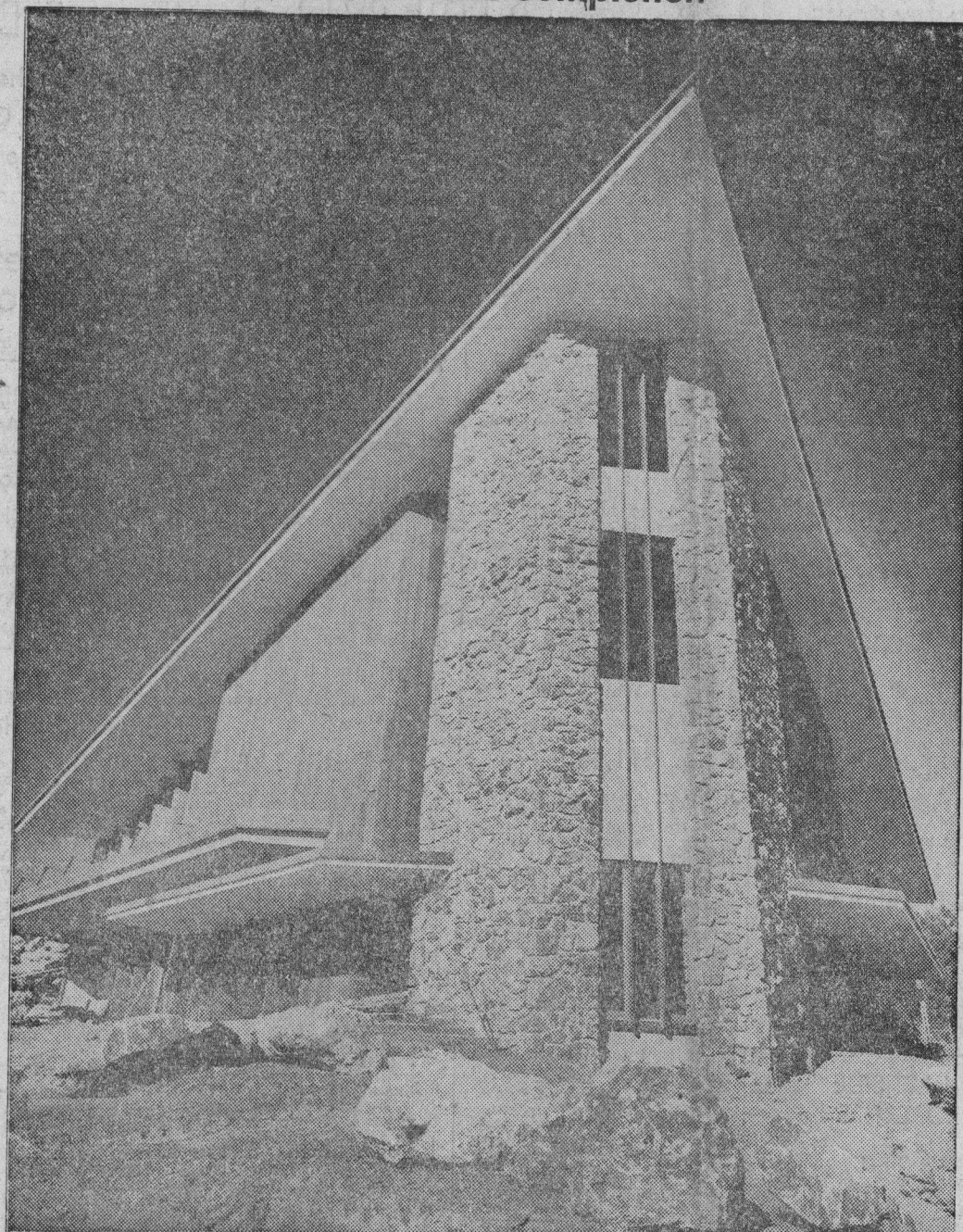


Church Nears Completion



The \$750,000 First Congregational church complex on High street near Moore street will be completed and ready for first full services sometime after the first of the year, Rev. J. Bernard Corneliussen said this week. The sanctuary, upper picture, is expected to be the last completed, while the Christian education building and fellowship hall are virtually ready to be accepted from the contractor now, the minister said.
