Scotts Valley To Fight On

Early reactions of disappoint- by Supervisors Nelson, McCallie ment and frustration over exclusions in the proposed Scotts Vallev city boundaries this week appear to have changed to determination and a growing optimism today.

L. J. Cardwell, a chairman of a joint steering committee between the valley chamber of commerce and property owners association, said this morning "we may really get in boom incorporation now. They (supervisors) have really made people mad."

Cardwell revealed he has asked Saratoga city attorney Faber L. Johnston to appear before a pubtic meeting Monday night and give his opinion as to the legality of the two major exclusions.

The meeting will be held in the teachers' room of Scotts Valley school on Bean Creek road, starting at 8 p.m., Cardwell said.

Supervisors Monday cut the e s Santa Cruz-city owned Scotts Vallev Sky Park airport and the site of a Memorial park cemetery out C s of the proposed city boundaries, and set April 14 as election date s for incorporation.

Supervisor Francis Silliman d had opposed the exclusions, paril ticularly the cemetery property, a- because "this cemetery is the y- crux of the whole incorporation a effort. It just wouldn't be cricket to exclude it," but was out-voted

and Locatelli. Robert Burton was away on vacation, but also asked that no exclusions be made.

Cardwell, who said Tuesday, "We can't stir enough interest now," reported his attitude totally changed since talking with valley residents. "There were a lot of people on the fence, and they think we got a pretty raw deal.

"Now they are kind of riled up. I think now things look pretty good. We'll hear what the lawyers have to say and decide where we go from there," he concluded.

County Counsel William Card said today, however, that the county board's actions "are entirely legal, as far as I can see. The law reserves the right to set boundaries for supervisors."
