

Kemper Appeared In Court Today

Accused mass - slayer Edmund Emil Kemper made a brief appearance today in Santa Cruz Superior Court to receive psychiatrists' reports regarding his sanity, but the matter was continued until Friday.

Dist. Atty. Peter Chung told Judge Harry Brauer that one of the two court-appointed psychiatrists, Dr. Joel Fort, was unable to complete his report on whether Kemper is able to understand the charges against him and stand trial.

Brauer continued the hearing until Friday. Also scheduled Friday is a hearing on a motion by Kemper's attorney, Jim Jackson, that evidence and confessions by Kemper be forbidden from being used during the trial.

Jackson charges that the evidence and the confessions

were illegally obtained because Kemper wasn't given the opportunity to consult an attorney.

Kemper's jury trial is scheduled to commence next Monday. He is charged with killing eight women, including his mother. He was arrested in May in Pueblo, Colo., where he claimed he killed six young women, his mother, and his mother's best friend.

B-E Day Canceled, No Interest

Business - Education Day, in which teachers visit local businesses, has been canceled this year for lack of teacher interest.
