SC City Stick To Special U

The Santa Cruz City Planning Commission stuck to its guns last night and reaffirmed its stand on the boundaries of the Civic Center Special Use District.

The city council at its last meeting referred the boundary map back to the planners and asked them to consider reducing the district's area. In particular, the council wanted the area south of Walnut avenue trimmed from the map.

"If anything, (the district) is too small to accommodate what's planned for future years," Commissioner Vern Austin declared at last night's session.

Most of the commission agreed with Austin. Planners thought the area south of Walnut should be included in the district to protect the appearance of the buildings that will face the district on the south side of that avenue.

Commissioner Cecil Bates, however, restated his distaste for the whole Special Use classification. "I never thought too much of SU to begin with," he stated. "I don't think the council does either. I think they're just trying to trim it down some."

Bates abstained as the other members of the commission voted to reaffirm their stand on the district's boundaries.

The city council can still trim the district to whatever size it wishes without scrapping the whole project.
