Apping into spring break

Park sets up zip line, gets parts for new Undertow coaster

SANTA CRUZ — The Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk's new 26-foot high Fly Wire Zipline on the beach takes viewing the Monterey Bay to a new level.

"Zip lines have been gaining in popularity all over the county, and we wanted guests to test it out," Boardwalk spokesman Kris Reyes said.

The temporary twin zip line, available for \$10 per ride the next two weeks, is one of the park's latest additions.

With a new track — currently in the Boardwalk's parking lot — arriving from Germany last Friday, construction of the park's new Undertow roller coaster is under way, with opening set for June.

The park also renovated the waiting area of the Giant Dipper, added a new Birthday Room and is planning for spring break.

Spring break, hosted April 1-5, will include inflatable activities and competitions on the beach, interactive booths, Battle of the Bands, appearances by SpongeBob

SquarePants, and \$5 off rides and attractions with a coupon available online.

The park's upgrades and additional activities are a way to dust off the winter hours and spring into summer, said spokeswoman

Brigid Fuller.

"We've been quiet for a while, so it's time to remind people that things are

picking up," she said.


Not to mention the changes in the Giant Dipper's halls. The walls of the landmark ride, which turns 90 next year, feature fresh paint, along with statistics and painted photos from the park's archives for people to glance at while waiting.

"It's a pretty major sprucing-up of the inside," Fuller said. "We're just trying to freshen it up and keep it looking

good."

While the Giant Dipper's walls and the Undertow's parts in the parking lot are noticeable, the Fly Wire Zipline stands out the most. The 225-foot zip line is operated by Extreme Engineering, a manufacturer of mobile and portable rock climbing walls and zip lines for amusement parks.

The zip line runs parallel to the Boardwalk on Main Beach. Riders can reach speeds up to 21 mph and the attraction can hold people weighing from 45 pounds to 250 pounds. Two

people can ride at a time.

"Everybody loves it, of course," said Craig Hamilton, director of operations for Extreme Engineering.

And if people are looking to host a celebration at the Boardwalk, the park now features a Birthday Room, available to rent for \$150.

"It's kind of nice, because people have been asking us for a place to keep a cake cold and get a group together," Fuller said.
