## Teachers teach teachers during educational faire

**APTOS** — The county's second annual Teacher Faire for educators and community members will be Saturday at Cabrillo College from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The event is sponsored by the Santa Cruz County Curriculum Council.

The 40 workshops, keynote speaker from Stanford, exhibits and "freebie room" will allow teachers to get together and teach each other, said UCSC's Ellen Moir, one of the event's organizers.

Last year's fair drew 150 educators and

was an "incredible success," she said. This year, organizers hope to host twice that number.

Ten to 15 years ago, the state allotted money for sufficient in-service training, Moir and two other organizers, Liz Merriam and Breta Holgers, explained. With that money drying up, programs like the Teacher Faire provide educators an opportunity to learn and to grow.

"If you've got something that works, it's exciting to share it," one said. "This is better than professionally-taught in-service training. Often, the professionals have been away from the classroom for several years. But there's a lot of trust for teachers out there in the field."

Workshop topics will include computers in education, children's literature, enlivening mathematics, helping children write, community history and multicultural education.

"The Art and Science of Teaching" is the keynote address to be given by Larry Cuban, Stanford professor of education.

Commercial and non-commercial exhibits will be featured, and there will be a room full of free materials for classroom use.

A buffet lunch, morning coffee and afternoon cider and cheese are included in the \$7.50 registration fee.
