-Stockton Ave. on the east side from the Esplanade to Capitola Ave.

—San Jose Ave. on the east and west sides of the street from the Esplanade to Capitola Ave.

-Monterey Ave. on the east side of the street from the southerly line of Capitola Ave. to El Camino Medio and on the west side from Capitola Ave. to Park Place.
