Board OKs Watsonville annexation

WATSONVILLE — For the first time in 12 years, a piece of land has been annexed to the city of

Watsonville.

While the land in question — less than a quarter-acre of unincorporated land near the intersection of Freedom and Airport boulevards — is not particularly significant, the approval Wednesday by the county Local Agency Formation Commission is.

Watsonville City Manager Steve Salomon said Thursday that LAF-CO's unanimous approval "moves us in the right direction" for LAF-CO possibly approving Watsonville's new General Plan

and sphere of influence.

The city is currently in the timeconsuming process of redoing both plans, which are blueprints for future growth.

Watsonville has not annexed any land in 12 years. The controversial Franich property gained tentative approval a few years ago, but never was annexed.

Wednesday's annexation of the \(\frac{1}{3} \)-acre parcel was initiated by property owners Lloyd and Thelma Graybeal. They owned two parcels there: one was within the city of Watsonville and the other was unincorporated county land.
