

Cabrillo Seeks First Win Tomorrow

SJS Frosh Next Foe For 'Hawks

Still searching for that elusive first win, the Cabrillo Seahawks will make their second "home" appearance of the current grid season Saturday night when they entertain San Jose State's frosh at Memorial field.

This will be the second of three "home" encounters scheduled here with the 'Hawks playing host to Hancock of Santa Maria October 24. Three other Cabrillo "home" games will be played in Watsonville.

Saturday's kickoff has been set for 8 o'clock and Cabrillo has been installed as a three-point favorite. A 4:30 o'clock preliminary encounter pits Santa Cruz high's junior varsity against the Bellarmine Jayvees.

While Cabrillo has lost two games to date (26-6 to San Francisco State's junior varsity and 36-30 to Sierra college), the Seahawks, under the direction of head coach Larry Siemering, play a type of football interesting to all spectators. Their basic offense is the winged-T, the same as employed by Harry Anderson, Spartanbabe coach.

After literally giving away the first two games, Cabrillo has emphasized defense all week. Last Saturday the Seahawks seemed to have a 30-28 victory in their grasp when a bad pass from center set up a Sierra touchdown that led to defeat.

Two weeks ago in Cabrillo's historical first game, the Seahawks saw seven pass attempts fall into the hands of the S.F. enemy and the new Santa Cruz county college went on to lose the ball five times via fumbles and give up 130 yards by penalties.

San Jose State's frosh team has played one game and suffered a 41-8 stomping at the hands of the College of San Mateo. This is the main reason the Seahawks get the edge for Cabrillo scrimmaged San Mateo three weeks ago and the peninsula eleven held a two touchdown margin over the 'Hawks even though no official score was kept for the workout.

Cabrillo holds nearly an eight pound per man advantage in the weight department—if that means anything. Up front, where they say it counts, the Seahawk line

Berkeley (AP). — Quarterback George Izo and halfback Red Mack return to the Notre Dame lineup Saturday when the Fighting Irish conduct the third inter-sectional football test for California's Bears.

To date the Bears have flunked

Fleet Oregon Duck Backfield Meets Spartan Passing Game

San Jose (AP). — Unbeaten Oregon sends its fleet backs against San Jose State here tonight, hoping for a fourth straight victory.

Quarterback Dave Grosz operates the Oregon attack that has beaten Stanford, Utah and Washington State. Grosz has gained 362 yards rushing and passing, including 255 through the air.

San Jose may throw even more passes with Emmett Lee and Ray Podesto dividing the quarterback chores. In beating Hawaii 44-14 last week, Lee threw three touchdown passes, scored twice himself and kicked one extra point. He accounted for 170 yards on passes with 11 completions in 16 attempts.

The Cabrillo backfield outweighs San Jose by almost 16 pounds per man but you must consider that 140-pound scabback Bill Palmer holds the Freshmen weight down in this department considerably.

The visitors from the Santa Clara valley also boast a name quite big in football. That's Eddie Erdelatz Jr., son of the former United States Naval academy coach.

While Eddie is not in the starting lineup, he probably will see considerable action at a fullback position. He weighs 180.

Cabrillo lost the services of halfback Ken Negro in the Sierra game as the Soquel star suffered a broken hand. He may be lost for the entire season. Jim Berry has an infection in an eye, but he may see action tomorrow night. If not, George Kusanovich, 240-pound Holy Cross graduate may go in his place.

Halfback John Kirby, the 1958 prep "Player of the Year," was suffering from the flu earlier this week and at first it was thought that Warren Penniman, another Holy Cross grad, would take his place. But Siemering said yesterday, "Kirby will probably be there when the game starts."

Guard Charles Lass also had a touch of the flu earlier this week and it is not yet known whether he'll be ready. One thing is sure—Cabrillo is ready and hungry.
