Planning Department sets permit application rules

SANTA CRUZ — The Santa Cruz County Planning Department has developed an elaborate applications process to contend with a possible 1,000 new building permit applications.

The department plans to start accepting new applications Jan. 24 after having been closed to regular business since Oct. 17. Telephone service for questions will begin

Jan. 22.

Since the earthquake, county planners have focused their efforts on issuing permits for earthquake-related repairs only. More than 3,000 emergency permits have been issued since Oct. 17, Planning Director Dianne Guzman said.

"Reopening after a three-month shutdown presents some signficant challenges,"

Guzman said.

Appointments will be needed for most types of permit applications, she said. The department will issue appointments by mail to applicants who fill out request cards. Packets detailing application instructions and procedures will be available at six county locations beginning Wednesday.

Guzman said as many as 1,000 applications

may be waiting to be filed.

"The worst thing we could do is open our doors at 8 a.m. some morning and try to deal with it on a first-come first-serve basis," she said. "It would be a disaster."

Instead, the department will schedule appointments on a random selection basis for people who submit completed cards by 5 p.m. Jan 22, or who mail them by Jan. 19.

Guzman said she has assigned additional staff to answer planning questions by phone

from 8 a.m. to noon and 1 to 5 p.m. beginning Jan. 22. Building permit information will be available at 425-2745. Zoning information will be available at 425-2701.
