

City Planners To Consider Rezoning For Proposed Convention Center Site

The biggest item on the agenda for tomorrow's Santa Cruz City Planning Commission is a proposed rezoning of the Lighthouse Point site of Santa Cruz' proposed convention center.

The meeting will get underway at 7:30 p.m. in the city council chambers.

Plans call for rezoning of the property to the planned development classification, a move that would allow almost any kind of development, as long as it conforms to a specific plan which must first be approved by the city.

Representatives of a San Leandro firm that plans extensive commercial developments in conjunction with the convention center will present their plans.

Also on the agenda is a use permit request by E. J. Silva to install two self-service gasoline pumps at his 1420 Mission Street drive-in dairy operation.

Other items slated for consideration include a use permit request to remodel the Regal service station at 1024 Water Street and a variance request by Edna M. Cook to create a

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non-conforming front yard at 154 Trescony Street.
