

# Kemper Attorney Questions How Evidence Gained

A motion seeking to disallow as evidence all statements made to police by accused mass-slayer Edmund Kemper has been filed in Superior Court by the defendant's attorney, Public Defender Jim Jackson.

Superior Court Judge Harry Brauer will hear arguments on the motion Oct. 12, three days before Kemper is scheduled for jury trial.

Jackson indicated that all the admissions by Kemper, including his telephone conversation with local police while he was in Pueblo, Colo., and his leading investigators to places where he had disposed of some bodies, were made before the defendant had been allowed to consult with an attorney.

"He was literally held incommunicado," Jackson said. "He was held overnight at the Santa Rita jail farm in Alameda County under the assumed name of Jameson the first night he arrived back in the state."

Jackson and his investigator, Harold Cartwright, are now in Pueblo to question police witnesses about the details of Kemper's arrest and statements he made following the arrest.

If the statements made by Kemper are not admissible, Jackson said, then all of the physical evidence — including the discovery of butchered bodies lawmen f If the statements made by Kemper are not admissible, Jackson said, then all of the physical

evidence — including the butchered bodies to which the defendant-led lawmen — would be excluded from evidence the prosecution could introduce in its case against Kemper.

## Soquel Drive Road Work

Beginning today, traffic on Soquel Avenue between Frederick Street and Park Way will be restricted to two lanes to enable the city to build a relief sewer line.

The approximately \$60,000 project is expected to take about 45 days to complete, according to Dick McKinney, associate civil engineer in the city public works department.

"We strongly suggest motorists use alternate routes whenever possible," McKinney said.

The sewer line is to relieve strain on the present sewer system north of Soquel Avenue and to increase the area sewage handling capacity, McKinney said.
