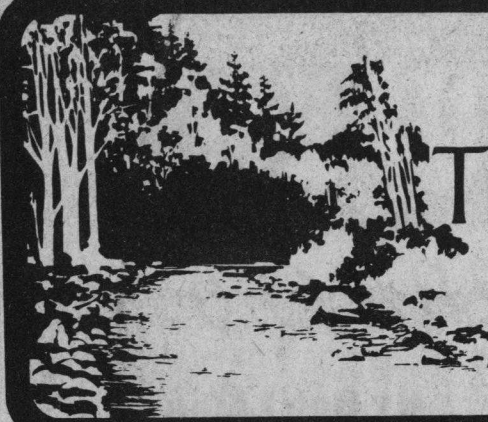

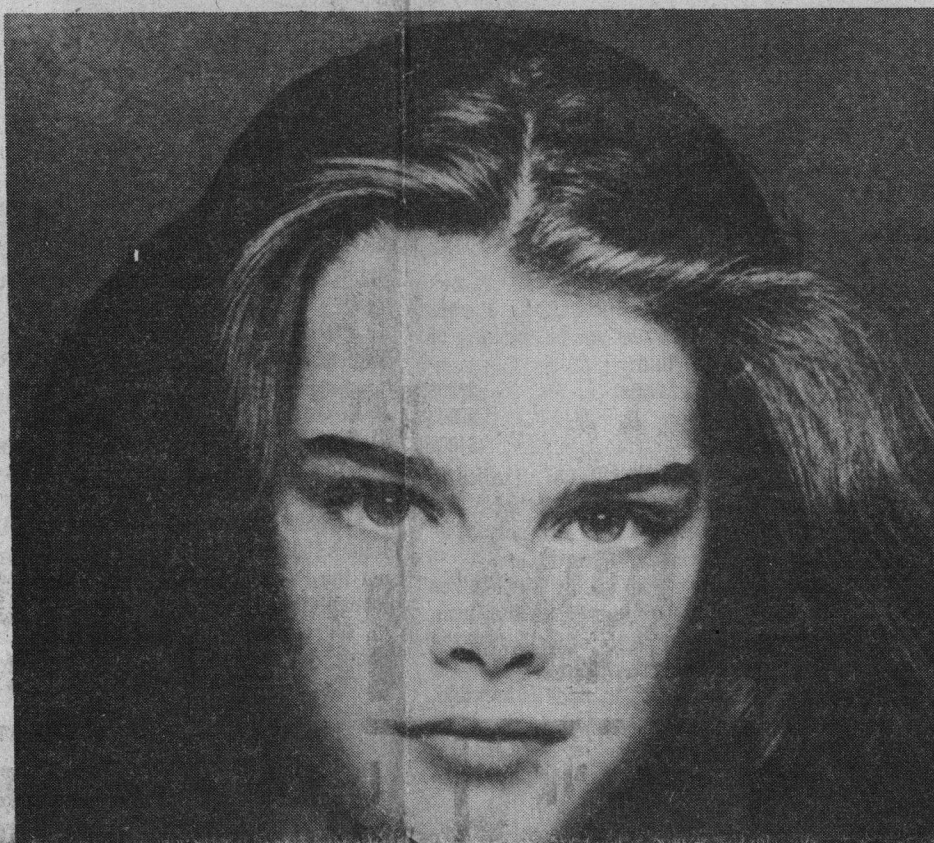

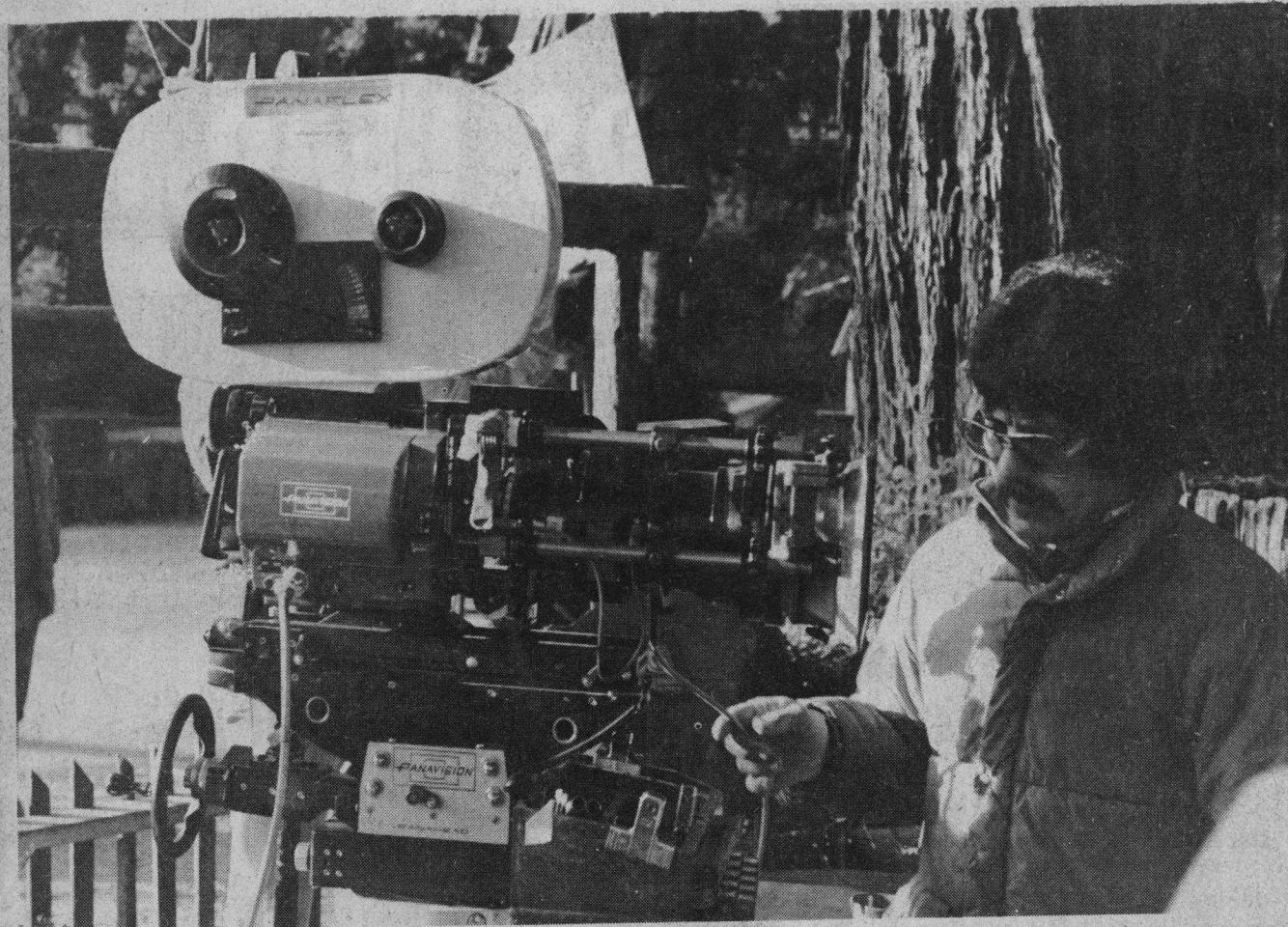


Ben Lomond is moved to Arizona for 'Tilt'

Brooke Shields—12-year-old movie star

If you go see the movie "Tilt" in a few months when it comes out you'll likely see the San Lorenzo Valley in part of it.

The movie was being filmed in Ben Lomond and Felton last week, with the crews still in Felton on Monday of this week at the Felton Guild building.

Motorists traveling along Highway 9 when the crews were going to or from the shooting from their headquarters in

Santa Cruz couldn't miss them. Large motor homes with "Tilt" signs carrying equipment and personnel formed a near caravan.

There were other evidences, too, of the "Hollywood" presence. For example a road sign on Highway 9 leading south out of Ben Lomond on Thursday identified the road as an Arizona highway and gave distances to Arizona towns.

Star of the movie about

pinball hustlers is 12-year-old Brooke Shields, who plays a hip 14-year-old pinball whiz.

Much of the movie is the story of her relationship with an aspiring young rock singer, played by Ken Marshall.

A model turned actress, Brooke recently completed a starring role in a film for Paramount Pictures, "Pretty Baby."

Before that she appeared in a made-for-television movie,

"The Prince of Central Park."

She also acted in the TV production of Arthur Miller's "After the Fall" and a Allied Artists' "Alice Sweet Alice."

Born on May 31, 1965, the young star was discovered at the tender age of 11 months by photographer Francesco Scavullo to pose for Ivory Soap advertisements.

She later became a Breck Girl. She also appeared in Richard Avedon's Colgate ads for four consecutive years.

She is the daughter of Revlon executive Frank Shields and his ex-wife Teri.

Producer-director Rudy Durand originally planned to film "Tilt" on location in Texas. He changed his mind, however, and picked the Santa Cruz area when he discovered the city quite by accident; his car broke down returning to Los Angeles from San Francisco, forcing him to spend the day here.

"It was an ironic situation," explained Durand.

"The script called for several scenes to be shot in Santa Cruz, the remainder in Texas.

"But after one look at the Victorian homes, the beauty of Santa Cruz and the surrounding flatland towns with their Mexican population and culture identical to that found in Texas—I was sold on shooting 'Tilt' in Santa Cruz."

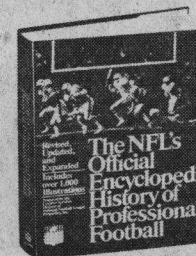
