## SC City Library Too Small, Jury Says In Report

The Santa Cruz city library is too small for present needs, the final report of the 1959 Santa Cruz County Grand Jury brings out.

In a section covering Santa Cruz city buildings, the grand jury explained the library building is well kept under the circumstances. Plans are under way for a new and much larger edifice.

"Until this is done, the present building will be used as now—in a very crowded condition," the report states.

Other city buildings were given top ratings. The city hall was reported as an "outstanding building with beautiful gardens." Members of the grand jury public works committee, headed by Clyde White, noted that the city hall is "very well maintained and attracts many out-of-town visitors."

Reports of excellent condition and good maintenance were given to the police department and city jail. The civic auditorium was described as "excellent" and well maintained. Some portions of the interior should be repainted, according to the report.
