

Baptists To Dedicate Camp Hammer Sunday Afternoon

An Olympic swim star will be among those helping dedicate Camp Hammer Sunday at 2:30 p.m. The Twin Lakes Baptist summer camp is located on Big Basin highway.

Cathy Ferguson is the 16-year-old granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. Bert Ferguson of the Twin Lakes church, who donated the camp swimming pool in her honor.

The flag raising ceremony at camp Sunday will be conducted by the church Boy Scout troop number 199 which also will provide a color guard.

The Harbor Masters, men's group from the church, will provide special music. Dr. Roy Kraft, Twin Lakes pastor, will be in charge of the service.

Cathy, a 1964 Olympic gold medal winner who has been labeled "sweet sixteen and unspoiled," is ranked the top woman backstroke swimmer in the United States. She also is rated as the greatest feminine athlete produced by the Los Angeles Athletic club since diving champion Pat McCormick. Her world record for the 100-meter backstroke still stands at 1:07.8.

She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. David Ferguson of Burbank where she will be a senior in high school this fall.

Cathy will speak Sunday and will present a swim demonstration of various strokes, plus her specialty—the backstroke. Her

father will narrate the demonstration as Cathy swims.

The youth camp has long been a dream of Dr. Kraft of the Twin Lakes church. Two years ago when the present camp property was offered for sale, Dr. Kraft and his brother,

Ralph, "tied up" the land with the thought that it would be ideal for a Christian camp.

In January of 1964 a lay person in the church took over the financial obligation and in August a permit was granted to establish a youth camp. Water was

developed from Bloom creek and brush and dead trees were removed. The first building was begun in June of this year and the first camp sessions were conducted in August. Immediate future plans include a kitchen and dining hall, to be completed by next summer.
