> When the deputy pulled the man over, the driver got out of his car with a gun at his side and "invited" the deputy to shoot him, Hemingway said. The man then went into the law office.

Los Gatos police were told to be on the lookout for a man who could be suicidal, Miller said.

Los Gatos High School students were told to stay home, but teachers reported for work, school spokeswoman Donna Jeffries said.
