The new county health center, one of the most modern and well equipped in the state, will be formally dedicated June 11.



A soundproof room is especially equipped for hearing tests. Included in the clinic section is a TB X-ray room. The left wing in the front section has the sanitaıma tion staff room and dairy inspecin tion offices. Centrally located in the building is a large central file room and clerical pool office, approximately 25 by 20 feet in size.

The public health laboratory, tist containing 600 square feet, is considered by Dr. Ferguson to be one of the newest and best equipped inspection labs in the state.

Other offices in the building include a dental room and large lobby for the clinic section.
