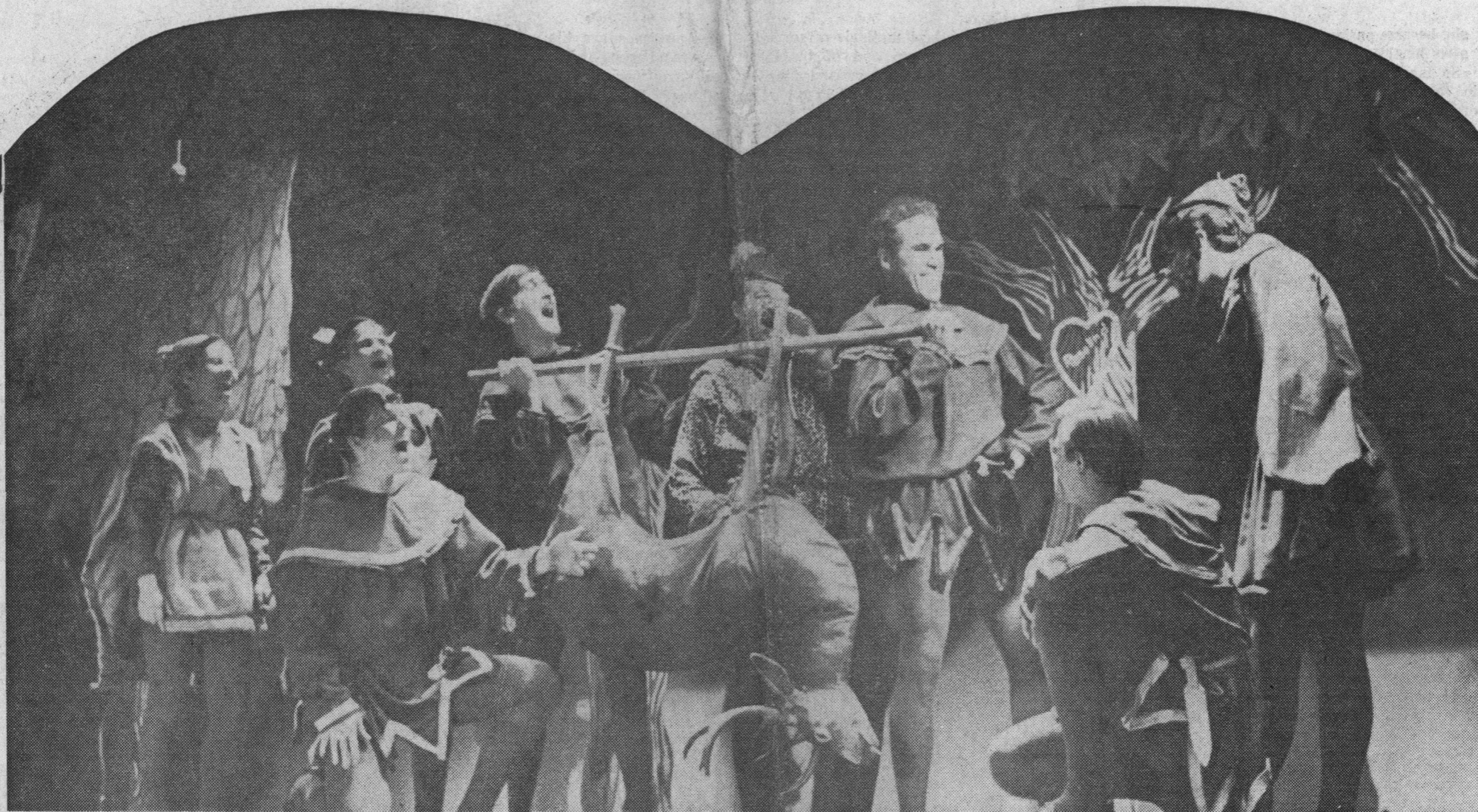

The Jester (Tom Motter) and Audrey (Konni Evans) have a physical thing going.

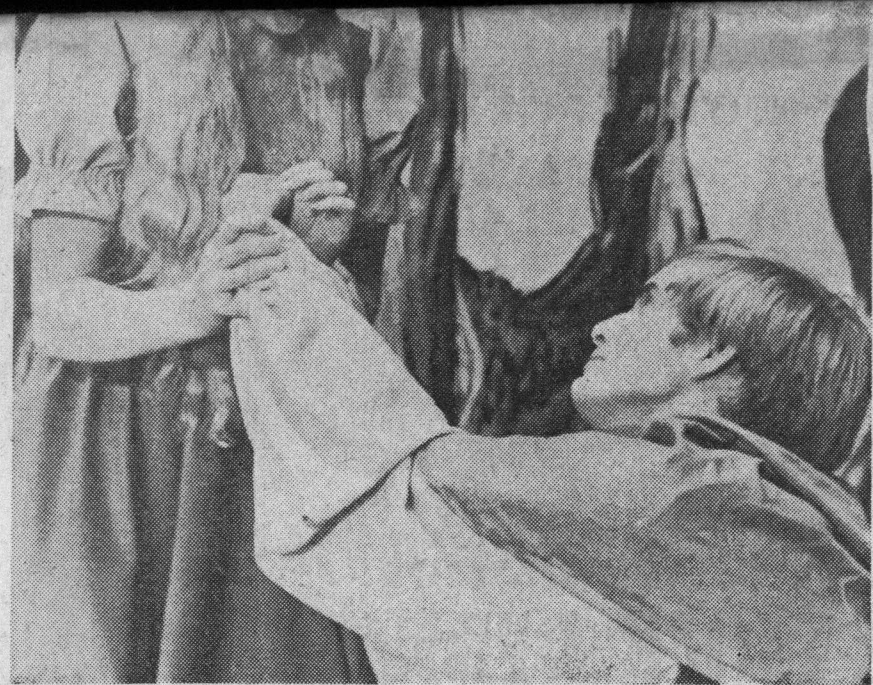
It came to sizing up people—all sorts of people.

Along with this intriguing view of loves in action, the Bard includes a girl masquerading as a boy, a battered but reformed duke, disguised princesses and others.

Shakespeare even explores the effects of background on love. Scenes are set either at the corrupt and wicked court, or in the repose and sweetness of Arden Forest.

"As You Like It" is a pastoral comedy, the sweetest and happiest of all Shakespeare's plays. It has something for everyone—even music.
