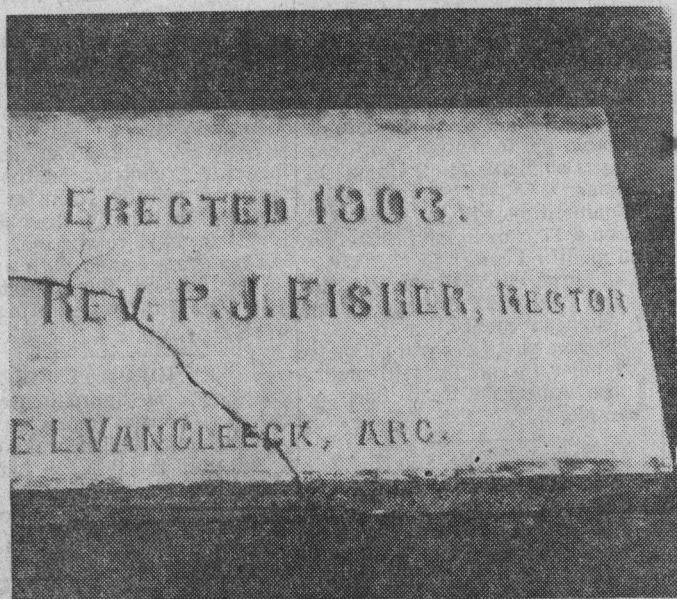


Old Rectory Being Torn Down



The Holy Cross Rectory which has been standing since 1903 is being torn down so a new and more modern rectory may be built. The rectory was built when Rev. R. J. Fisher was the rector. Made completely of redwood the house had many solid wood pillars, some hand carved. The house also was built with a complete intercom system—the speaking tube variety—which the priests used until they moved out a few weeks ago. Standing on the steps, left to right, are J. The Rectory cornerstone laid at the time the house was built, is being preserved in the Mission museum near the church. Another monument, which can-

not be preserved, however, is a beam in the foundation of the building on which the original builders wrote their names and the date, October 1903.
