

Electrica mishap blamed in

SANTA CRUZ — A blaze that damaged portions of the Town Clock on Sunday night was caused by an overheat-ed electrical part, investigators said Monday.

The fire caused about \$10,000 damage. It came a day after a new statue — named Collateral Damage — was dedicated beside the Town Clock on Water Street

at Pacific Avenue. The statue was a remembrance of civilian casualties of war. Investigators said there was no connection between the fire and the sculp-

"The timing seems really suspicious, but it appears to have been nothing more than a coincidence," said than a coincidence," said Santa Cruz Parks and Recreation Director Jim Lang.

Fire Chief George Lopes said the fire started in the second-story cornice of the clock, when an electrical part of a light heated up and caught fire. It quickly burned portions of the 100-year-old structure. Automat-ic sprinklers saved the clock. An insurance adjuster will

inspect the clock this week.
