The drag boat "Miss California," dragging for the General Fish corporation, went to San Francisco Friday, but will return.

It has been dragging for bait and has been very successful in catching sardines and squid.

Its largest catch of squid reached 10 tons. Most of the squid are caught on the opposite side of the bay.

Squid is a species of the octopus and some call them ink fish. Those who relish it as food speak highly of it. The Latins and Orientals are especially fond of squid. These were dried in great quantities by Chinese and Japanese on the Monterey side of the bay and sent to the Orient.

Serafino Canepa, the oldest net fisherman, was out and returned on Thursday. He came back with a good sized sandpaper shark, soles and skates.

Trub Ghio and Steve Ghio and Giacomo Stagnaro and Dan Olivieri were out Thursday morning, each boat manned by two, and set their lomparo nets, for sardines for bait.

It was a mere handful of bait, but their nets got entangled on the rocky bottom off Lighthouse point. The rocks damaged these nets so that the four spent over a day repairing the tears. The damage reached over \$50.

Port Captain Detail Hart has about completed his second skiff. He has proved to be a good boat builder and has been going about the bay in one of them.

Steve Ghio with 210 pounds of rock cod, and Cottardo Ghio with 280 pounds of rock cod came in to the Santa Cruz Fisheries.
