



Town Clock Project Continues

This reminder of the city's official Bicentennial Year project went up Monday at the head of Pacific Avenue Garden Mall. The clock tower shown will be built over the present Morris Fountain, with the water leaping and splashing in the tower arch while the Old Town Clock marks time for the third century of national existence. Donations are needed to help pay for the work and may be made through the city finance office at city hall. A \$1 donation will get the donor a button with the illustration shown. Bronze medallions, silver medallions, bricks and even plaques are available for other donations

ranging from \$10 to \$500. Robert Darrow, right, is chairman of the Citizens Committee on Community Improvement, which conceived and is coordinating the project. City signmaker Brian Covey gives the sign a final touch that just happens to indicate the money needed to complete the project. The city has contributed thousands of dollars in cash and services, and craftsmen have contributed hundreds of hours of work to restore the Old Town Clock that marked the turn of the century atop the IOOF building farther down the mall.
