Mrs. Liddicoat refused to back down on any of her accusations Monday morning; she repeated and elaborated on them. She did say she believed the press had blown the issue out of proportion and repeated a charge she makes frequently, that the press in general and the Register-Pajaronian in particular, are protective of Matthews while portraying her as "the wicked

"It was kind of a casual comment," she said of her remarks to Mayor Johnston. (Johnston said this morning he didn't remember that Mrs. Liddicoat had said Matthews was linked with criminal activity in Watsonville, but he said, "I never tied Chris with any gangs.")

Then Mrs. Liddicoat made some casual remarks about the Watsonville supervisor.

Among her accusations: "He's an immoral, drunken bum . . . he drinks in the morning and is always in the bars . . . he has a whole pattern of protecting criminals . . ."

She conceded that, since "I don't go to bars," she hadn't
