Work To Begin On Land Use Plan For Site

Plans to develop a site development and land use plan for the area surrounding the Cowell ranch site and the periphery were discussed Friday at a meeting of city, county and chamber of commerce officials and representatives of the University of California.

The university board of regents recently agreed to pay 50 per cent of the cost of such a plan either for Santa Clara or Santa Cruz counties should the area not be selected for a university campus.

A site study is now being prepared for the Almaden site in Santa Clara county and a similar study is scheduled for the Cowell ranch region.

It is expected the results of the studies will be presented to the regents in December.

The firm of Livingston and Blayney of San Francisco are serving as consultants in the Almaden plan, financed by the city of San Jose.

In the Santa Cruz plan, the architectural firm of Campbell and Wong of San Francisco and Architect Lawrence Lackey, urban design consultant, have been conferring with city, county and officials of the Greater Santa Cruz Chamber of Commerce.

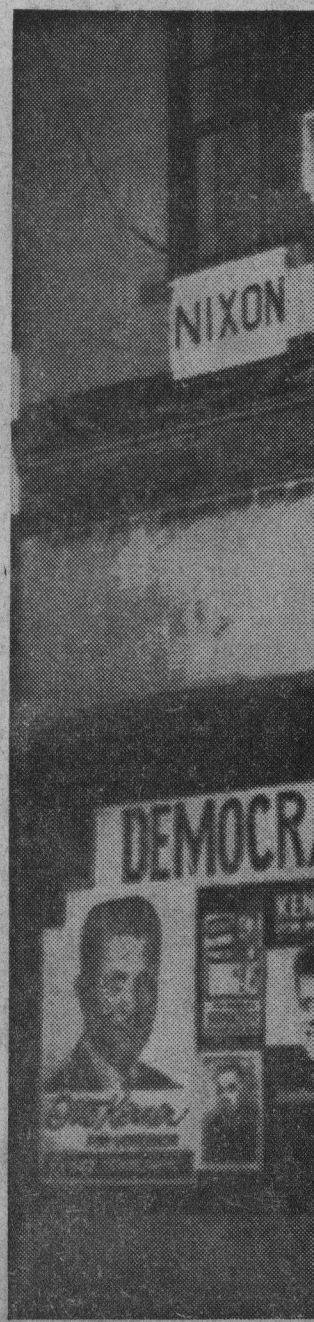
No details have been established yet as to how much the plan will cost or how it will be financed although it is expected that it will probably be a joint effort, involving the chamber of commerce, the city and possibly the county.

At a meeting Friday, the local officials, including City Manager Pete Tedesco, Lewis Nelson, chairman of the county board of supervisors, Gordon Sinclair and James Hammond of the chamber of commerce, met with Architects Worley Dong and Lackey and Robert Evans, university architect and Luigi Dusmet of the UC architects' staff to discuss what should be included in a land use plan for the Cowell area.

Because of the lack of available time, it is doubtful if the Santa Cruz plan will be as comprehensive in detail as the Almaden study.

Sinclair said "It is essential that a plan be prepared for the Santa Cruz area to acquaint the regents and university staff how the campus could be developed here and the extent of land which would be available for the university community."

"While we have presented considerable material to the university regarding the site, more detailed information is considered necessary in order to provide required data," he said. "The regents suggested that such a plan would be helpful in their studies," he concluded.
