## Aptos village traffic still worries Chamber

Ways to alleviate traffic parking problems. congestion in Aptos Village were discussed Thursday morning at the Aptos Commerce Chamber of meeting held at the Cook Book restaurant in Seacliff.

There will be a county Planning Commission candidates' forum for Second meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 17 at 7:30 p.m. in the Board of October. This will be done in Supervisor's room at the County Government Center in SDanta Cruz, and Chamber discussed the directors possibility of taking a stand regarding the Aptos traffic situation. Because of individual differences and a lack of information, directors decided against a Cahmber statement.

Director Lucile Aldrich addressed the group regarding a meeting she had with civil engineer Steven Raas where it "was proven" to her that "the one-way loop (around the village) will be the best people mover." The loop Mrs. Aldrich referred to is off of Soquel Drive to Hopkins Way, around Granite Way to Cathedral Drive, down to Trout Gulch Road and back to Soquel Drive.

While several other directors were in agreement with Mrs. Aldrich, the group decided there was not enough time to make a Chamber study and statement.

According to Bob McKenzie, who serves on both the Planning Commission and the Aptos Chamber, a decision will likely be made regarding traffic in the village at the commission planning meeting. In addition, he said, planners will consider funding

\$10,000 for a study of village

Chamber directors voted to endorse such a study, which will be conducted by county transportation planners, if approved.

In other business, directors:

-Voted to sponsor a District Supervisor in midconjunction with the League of Women Voters, who will supply timekeepers and a moderator.

-Heard a presentation by Ken Thomas from Santa Cruz Transportation County Commission on the upcoming "Alternative Transportation Week," scheduled for Oct. 12-19. The event will focus on single person commuter alternatives, and will feature parade, a forums, demonstrations and other educational events. Thomas received approval from directors to list Aptos Chamber as a supporting group for publicity purposes.
